Good afternoon Morag,

Thanks for your response.

Unfortunately due to the narrow width along this section of the A83 and with no suitable diversion route available, the road had to be closed in order to protect the safety of road users and the workforce. A hourly amnesty period was implemented to direct traffic through the site however, as you can hopefully understand, traffic could only be directed through the works when safe to do so.

The road remained closed for a short period each night after resurfacing works were completed to allow for material testing to take place under safe working conditions. Testing is done to ensure compliance with specification. Once the testing was completed, the closure was removed and the road was re-opened to traffic.

In regards to the advanced warning signs, we had hoped for them to be in place in advance of the works commencing however, due to a last minute change to our traffic management supplier for the works, there was some delay in getting these signs to site. We can understand the frustration this may have caused and we would apologise for this.

We did receive some feedback from the original consultation letter issued on the 13/01/2017 although, there was nothing regarding the timing of the works. Included within the consultation list is Karen Campbell – Community Council Liaison Officer (CommunityCouncils@argyll-bute.gov.uk) and it is our understanding that information is circulated to all CC's from this central contact.

Bear Scotland use the consultation period to address any concerns / issues highlighted by those affected and to also help plan the works to minimise disruption were possible. If these issues were highlighted during this consultation phase, allowing reasonable time to review, we may have been in a position to address this in advance of construction commencing.

With that being said, a 19:00 start was proposed due to local quarry time-band restrictions along this section of the network. With these restrictions in force, a later start would have certainly increased the duration of the works by a number of days, therefore causing a much longer period of disruption.
